



300th Anniversary 1710 ~ 2010



Numerous 300th Anniversary events are planned to commemorate the naming of Annapolis Royal in 1710 in honour of Queen Anne. (Powell)

This Area was originally called Te'wapskik ("Flowing Waters") by the Mi'kmaq. In 1605 it was named Port-Royal by the French. Over the next 105 years, the Area changed hands seven times between the French and the British. Captured by the British for the final time in 1710, the name was changed to Annapolis Royal to honor Queen Anne.

Team 300th is working with the community on a host of exciting events to commemorate this special year. Queen Anne and her best friend, Sarah Churchill, the Duchess of Marlborough will be on hand for many of the fun-filled activities.

Celebrate the Anglican Church's 300th Anniversary in Canada with a special Music Series at St. Luke's on May 16, Aug. 29 and Nov. 28. "Murder in the Cathedral" will be featured on Oct. 29. Unique historic church services will be held May 2, June 13, July 4, Aug. 1 and Oct. 10.

The 300th Anniversary of the Sinclair Inn is scheduled for June 5

and will include artisans, food, music and a 1710 Marketplace. The Ghosts of the Sinclair exhibit will be open June-September. With a touch of the keyboard, you can interact with ten ghosts from the building's past.

Queen Anne's Picnic on Aug. 8 features clowns, buskers, food and dance lessons. The 2010 Nova Scotia Heritage Conference will be held June 3-4, and a colourful gathering of Town Criers is on tap for Aug. 21.

Heritage Snapshot Weekend, August 28-29, will feature a special Five Century House Tour on Aug. 28. Old House Seminars with Christopher Cooper are set for Aug. 29 in addition to a festival of music with Wayne and Jeanne (Doucet) Currie and Harvey Marcot, traditional games and children's activities at Fort Anne.
