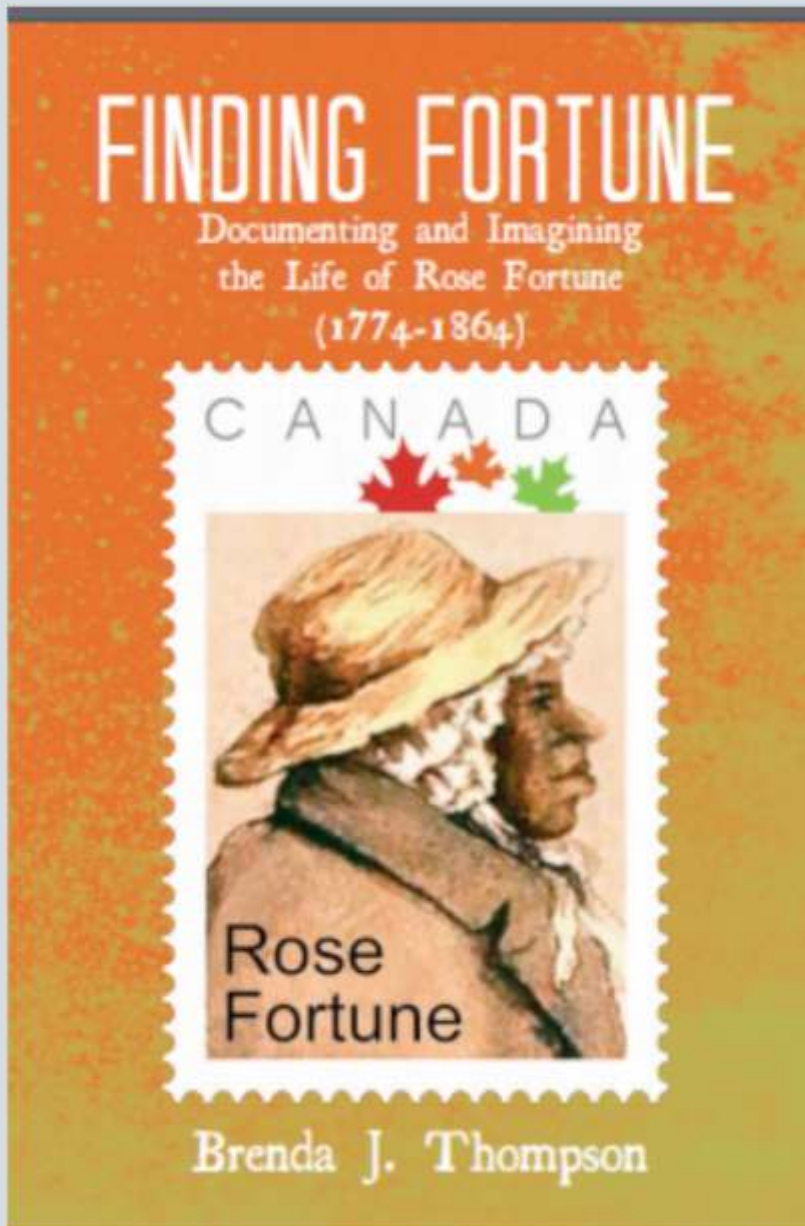


MEET ROSE FORTUNE & HER PARENTS

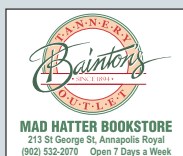
Brenda J. Thompson, best-selling author of "A Wholesome Horror; Poor Houses in Nova Scotia", launches her latest book:
